New Golf Members that have Junior Golfers in their family, please take a minute and read over the Junior Golf Policy. If you have a child that you would like the Golf & Green Committee to consider for Qualified Junior Status (Junior Golfers under the age of 16), please submit your letter to the Golf & Green Committee. You can email the letter or drop it off at the Golf Shop to the attention of Gregg Matthus.

### **Why is it important to establish a Handicap at Shady Hollow?**

If you are a Golf Member and want to play in our Club Tournaments you must establish a USGA Handicap at Shady Hollow. Stop in the Golf Shop and we can get you on your way to posting your scores. If you were a Member at another club before joining Shady Hollow, all we need is your GHIN # and we can transfer your USGA Handicap over to Shady Hollow. To establish a handicap you must post five 18 hole rounds, or post nine hole rounds that will be combined.

 Graduated Claymont High School in Uhrichsville, OH - 1979

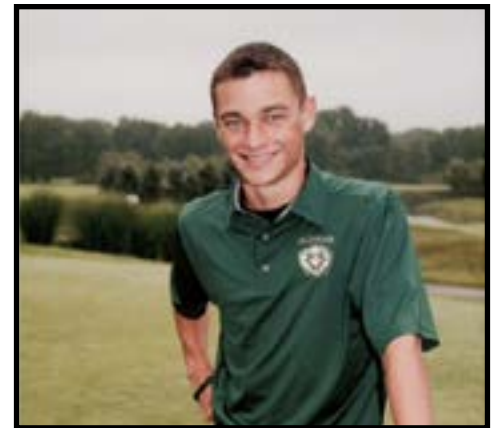

## 2017 Shady Hollow Golf Rules & Fees

### GOLF & GREEN COMMITTEE STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

The general purpose of the Golf & Green Committee is to provide guidance and direction to the Professional Golf Staff and Golf Course Maintenance Staff in the overall Golf Operations of the Club and to assist the Staff when necessary in those operations.

#### Responsibilities of the Golf & Green Committee

- Establish the calendar of Golf Events for the season
- Establish the format for certain Golf Events for the season
- To evaluate and make recommendations with respect to the Qualified Junior Golfer
- To serve as the Handicap Committee
- To serve as the Appeals Committee for Golf Tournaments
- Maintain excellent playing conditions on the Golf Course throughout the golf season

#### Golf Professional Staff

**PROMOTE GOLF:** To promote and elevate the game of golf at Shady Hollow Country Club so that the pursuit of the game by our Members and their Guests is an important part of their lifestyle and recreational pleasure.

**PROVIDE OUTSTANDING SERVICE:** To provide our Members and their Guests with outstanding service. We are strictly a service industry. Hence, it is important to keep in mind that our financial rewards can only be returned by the degree of service we provide. Avoid thinking in terms of pure profit; rather, think in terms of what we can do for the Members and Guests of our Club. The resulting better service provided from this approach will inevitably give the Golf Operation a greater financial return.

**THE NEED TO BE WELL INFORMED:** To be thoroughly knowledgeable about our Membership, their Families and Guests, and our own day-to-day operation. It is extremely important for us to know everything that is happening about the Club and community on a daily basis.

**IMAGE:** To present and maintain a professional, well organized, well managed, and service-oriented Golf Shop with a commitment to earning the business of every Member through the emphasis put on the quality and value of merchandise stocked.

**CONSISTENT POLICY:** Develop consistent policies that can be carried over a long-term period. Treat all Members and Guests the same. Be consistent with all on a daily basis, keeping in mind we wish to supply them with long-term benefits as well as short-term results. Be consistent with policies, procedures, and service.





## **SHADY HOLLOW COUNTRY CLUB HANDICAP POLICY**

### **The Handicap Committee**

The Handicap Committee within Shady Hollow Country Club is responsible for all aspects of the USGA Handicap System. To supervise golf activities, provide peer review, and maintain the integrity of the USGA Handicap System.

The Members Responsibilities for maintaining a Handicap Index in accordance with the USGA Handicap System  
-Acceptability of Scores

Fair handicapping depends upon full and accurate information regarding a player's potential scoring ability as reflected by a complete scoring record. Every player must be responsible for returning all acceptable scores. Equitable Stroke Control must be applied to all scores including Tournament Scores.

### **Handicap Index Adjustment by the Handicap Committee**

The Handicap Committee has the responsibility of making certain that each player has a Handicap Index reflecting potential ability. Under the following circumstances, it will be necessary for the Handicap Committee to adjust the player's Handicap Index. However, the following list is not all-inclusive, and a Handicap Committee has the ultimate authority to adjust a Handicap Index under any circumstance that it feels necessary to do so. Before an adjustment becomes effective, the Handicap Committee must give the player an opportunity to explain the circumstances surrounding the proposed adjustment, either in writing or by appearing before the committee. When an adjustment does become effective, it must be identified with the letter M, reflecting that the Handicap Committee has modified the Handicap Index.

### **Hole-In-One Policy**

This policy is in effect when the Golf Course is open. Each Golf Member: Husband & Wife are insured in the Hole-In-One Club for \$2.00 each to start the Golf Season. For each subsequent Hole-In-One thereafter a \$2.00 will be charged. This insurance applies only at Shady Hollow and can only be used for new purchases. Example: buying drinks, meals or Golf Shop merchandise.

## GOLF COURSE RULES & POLICIES

- In the spirit of golf, compliance with our Golf Rules is the responsibility of each Member and/or Guest. Enforcement of the Golf Rules is ultimately the responsibility of the Golf & Green Committee. The Golf & Green Committee may bring disciplinary issues before the Board of Directors for action if necessary
- Starting Times are required. Members are responsible for making Starting Times at the Golf Shop by phone or in person. Starting Times will not be accepted by leaving phone messages or by email. The Golf Professional Staff is not responsible for making any Member Starting Times without the mentioned communication
- All Social, Non Resident and Qualified Junior Golfers must register in the Golf Shop before beginning play
- All players must start from #1 tee unless authorized by the Golf Professional Staff to start from the #10 tee. When starting from #10 tee, players shall not begin playing until they can do so without delaying or holding up players approaching on # 9. Those players have the right of way
- A Club Tournament has the right of way. Players ahead shall give way upon request.
- Members and spouses of Members, who have an established handicap, will qualify for adult tournaments. Reserved Starting Times for Tournaments and Special Events may be instituted at the discretion of the Golf & Green Committee
- A foursome shall be the maximum number permitted to play together during the season May 15th through Labor Day
- Golfers are permitted to use Distance Only Measuring Devices that comply with USGA standards in all forms of competition in both Men and Women Tournaments
- Driving Range Hours will be posted in the Monthly Newsletter and Locker Rooms
- Practicing shall be confined to Practice Areas- the Driving Range, Putting Green and Chipping Green. Practicing on the Golf Course is not permitted
- Players are responsible for replacement of turf, raking of bunkers and repair of ball marks on greens

### **Dress Code on the Golf Course, Driving Range and Practice Areas**

- Proper golf attire is required for all players on the Golf Course, Driving Range and Practice Areas
- Men's Golf Shirts must have a collar. Turtlenecks and Mock Turtlenecks are appropriate golf attire. No tee shirts of any style.
- Golf Shorts are permitted but must be appropriate length for all golfers
- Blue jeans/denim, tennis shorts, athletic shorts, cutoffs, swim suits, halter tops and mesh tops are not appropriate golf attire and may not be worn
- It is recommended that Men's shirts remain tucked in on the Golf Course, Driving Range and Practice Areas
- Hats are not permitted to be worn backwards

## JUNIOR GOLF POLICY

- A Junior Golfer is a person under the age of sixteen. Junior Golfers are not be permitted on the Golf Course unless accompanied by an adult member. This rule shall not apply to organized play authorized by the Golf & Green Committee and supervised by the Golf Professional Staff
- Any Junior Golfer twelve years and younger must be accompanied by an adult at all times on the Driving Range and Practice Areas. This is as much for the safety of your child
- A Qualified Junior is a junior who is under the age of sixteen who has been awarded Qualified Junior Status by the Golf & Green Committee. In order to obtain Qualified Junior Status parents of the junior must submit a letter to the Golf & Green Committee making such a request. This letter may include, scoring history, tournament experience, team affiliation, organized instruction-instructor, knowledge of rules, years played, and any other information the parent would like the Committee to review. Upon receipt of this letter, the Golf & Green Committee will make its decision on whether or not to award Qualified Junior Status. A Qualified Junior may be on the Golf Course, Driving Range and Practice Areas during open times without being accompanied by an adult member. Only one letter per child per Golf Season may be submitted
- Inappropriate conduct as determined by the Golf & Green Committee or Golf Professional Staff may result in the loss of their Qualified Junior Status
- Qualified Junior Golfers are awarded a special Shady Hollow Bag Tag that will be used to identify this golfer anytime he or she is on the Golf Course, Driving Range and Practice Areas. This Bag Tag must be affixed to the Junior Golfer's golf bag at all times.
- A valid driver's license is required to operate and drive a golf cart on Shady Hollow property
- Juniors can use the appropriate locker room restroom when accompanied by an adult
- Parents shall be responsible for the behavior, conduct and dress code of their children at Shady Hollow Country Club at all times

## SOCIAL MEMBERS

- The husband and wife may have golf privileges up to five times each per year by payment of the Social Golf Fee (\$75.00). In addition, the husband and wife are permitted to play in Mixed Holiday and other designated events that do not have a full field of Full Golf Members by payment of Social Golf Fee and Event Fees Participation in such events will not be counted in the five times per year limit
- Golfing privileges do not extend to children of Social Members; however, they may play by paying the Guest Fee (\$75.00) and must be accompanied by an Adult. Family Guest Fees do not apply to Social Members bringing Family Guest out to play
- All Social Members must call for a starting time and register in the Golf Shop prior to playing golf

## GUESTS AND FEES

- Guest Fees are in effect at all times
- A Guest shall be permitted to use the Golf Course a maximum of five times in any one season
- No Member may have more than three Guests on Weekends before 12:00 or Fridays from 12:00 to 1:00. Unless approved by the Golf Professional. After 1:00 each Member may have a maximum of seven Guests. Members wishing to have more must have approval from the Golf Professional or Golf & Green Committee
- The Host Member must register all Guest at the Golf Shop before starting play

**Family Guest Fee** - does not include the cart fee. This fee is for Golf Members only, Includes family living outside the Member's home, limited to, parents, children and their spouses, grandparents, grandchildren, and brothers or sister All unmarried daughters and sons up to age twenty-one living at home and daughters and sons up to age twenty-five if living at home and attending a recognized institute of learning are not considered Family Guest and will not be charged a Family Guest Fee to play.

For billing purposes, completion of thirteen holes will constitute an 18-hole round and completion of four holes will constitute a 9-Hole round.

- An annual Golf Operation Fee of \$140.00 will be charged to each Golf Member Family
- Outside Golf Events must be approved by the General Manager/Golf Professional or the Golf & Green Committee



## MEMBER SPONSORED – UNACCOMPANIED GUEST POLICY

- Member may call as early as one week in advance to make a Starting Time for the Unaccompanied Group
- Starting Times will only be available during Non Peak Member Play - based on availability
- Payment can be made by: Member can put his/her Guest on their Shady Hollow Club Account or the Guest can use their credit card for payment
- The Unaccompanied Guest Fee is \$75 per player and includes golf cart
- Member cannot use their Golf Guest Passes
- The Family Guest Fee does not apply when using this Guest Policy
- All Guest will be charged at the Unaccompanied Guest rate of \$75 per player
- The same forms of payment can be used for food and beverage the day they play
- The Member must notify the Golf Shop when making the Starting Time which form of payment will be used
- As per our Golf Rules at Shady Hollow the Member will be responsible for the actions of their Guest before, during and after golf. The Member will also be liable for any and all incidental charges while their Guest are at Shady Hollow Country Club

## **GOLF CARTS & GOLF CART SAFETY**

- All golf carts now in use belong to Shady Hollow. The number of years of use of the golf carts and the related economic advantage to Shady Hollow will depend upon proper care. Anyone damaging or abusing golf carts will be subject to appropriate Board action
- Reservations for golf carts shall not be accepted. They shall be issued on a “first come, first serve” basis. Exception will be made only when doctor’s certificate of disability is presented to Golf & Green Committee
- Each golf cart shall carry no more than two persons and under no circumstances shall a caddy or other person ride on the back of a golf cart. Only two bags per cart
- Golf carts shall be used anytime except at the discretion of the Golf & Green Committee and/or the Golf Course Superintendent
- Golf carts shall not be driven within ten feet of tees or bunkers and shall not be driven within the first fifty feet of the fairway immediately in front of the green or within twenty- five feet of any area of the green
- Golf carts should be driven scattered throughout the course including the rough. Routing of carts by signs and ropes must be followed. Where defined cart paths exist, carts should be kept thereon. Do not drive golf carts over sprinkler heads
- As of the June, 2001 Board meeting, powered push/ pull carts are prohibited on the Golf Course

## **PUSH CART POLICIES**

- Considering the increased popularity of Push Carts, a set of policies is necessary to continue to uphold the stature of the Club and the condition of the Golf Course
- Push Carts should remain on the cart path in the vicinity of tees. At no time should the Push Cart be on the teeing ground
- Push Carts should not be taken on the approaches or fringes of the Green
- Push Carts should not be used within ten feet of any Green or Bunker
- Whenever practical, Push Carts should remain on the cart path

## **GOLF COURSE ETIQUETTE**

The following care of the Golf Course is expected of Members and their Guests: Repair ball marks properly - do not lift the soil upward, but rather push the turf forward towards the front of the ball mark. Golfers will refrain from placing putters or other objects in the cups, rake bunkers and leave rakes inside of bunkers, remove broken tees from teeing ground, replace divots on tees and fairways, and place litter in receptacles.

## GOLF COURSE MAINTENANCE SCHEDULE

**GREENS** - Through the peak golf season May through September, the green shall be mowed on a daily basis except Mondays at sunrise before play. Top dressing of green will be done twice per month April through August on a Monday. Green aerification will be scheduled for two dates: one in the Spring and again in the Fall.

**TEES** - Through-out the peak golf season, the tees will be mowed Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, weather permitting. Mowing tees will be permitted during play provided care is exercised. Divots will be filled once a week with par 3's filled more often as needed. Tee aeration will start after greens have been completed as weather permits.

**FAIRWAYS** - The fairways will be mowed on an as needed basis to produce the best possible playing surface. Mowing patterns will be staggered to prevent grass from lying over and also to create a nice checkered pattern on the turf. Divots will be filled weekly and we encourage you to use the cart bottles. There will be a refill station at the half-way house. Fairway aerification will take place during the Fall.

**ROUGHS** - The rough will be mowed Monday through Friday at varying heights depending on the season and conditions. Many out-of-play areas will be left to grow up to add definition to the golf course and also for ease of maintenance.

**BUNKERS** - Bunkers will be raked during the peak season on a daily basis (except Mondays). The bunkers will be properly edged and maintained on a regular schedule.

**MONDAYS** - The golf course will be closed every Monday until 1:00. The Front Nine will open at 1:00 and the Back Nine will be open at 3:00. This gives the Golf Course Superintendent and his crew the right of way for maintenance purposes. Additional aerating and top dressing, verti cutting, spiking, spraying, fertilizing, and watering of golf course will be done on a schedule maintained by the Golf Course Superintendent.
